5. If renting – payment history & renter's insurance

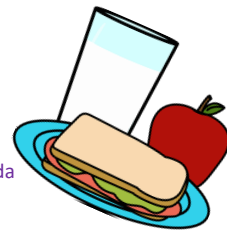
